Bird Habitat

Directions: Find the fundamental elements a bird needs to survive in your backyard:

- ☐ **Food:** Most birds you find in your backyard are insect eaters, but some also eat nuts, seeds, fruit, or nectar, depending on the species. Color the ground if you find food for birds.
- ☐ **Water:** Every bird needs water for drinking and bathing. Color the stream if you have a pond, stream, bird bath or other source of water.
- ☐ **Nesting:** Birds need a place to build a nest during breeding season. Color the trees and bushes if you have some in your backyard.
- ☐ **Shelter:** Birds need places to hide from predators and stay safe during storms. Color the sky if you find tree hollows, tall shrubs, or other forms of protection.



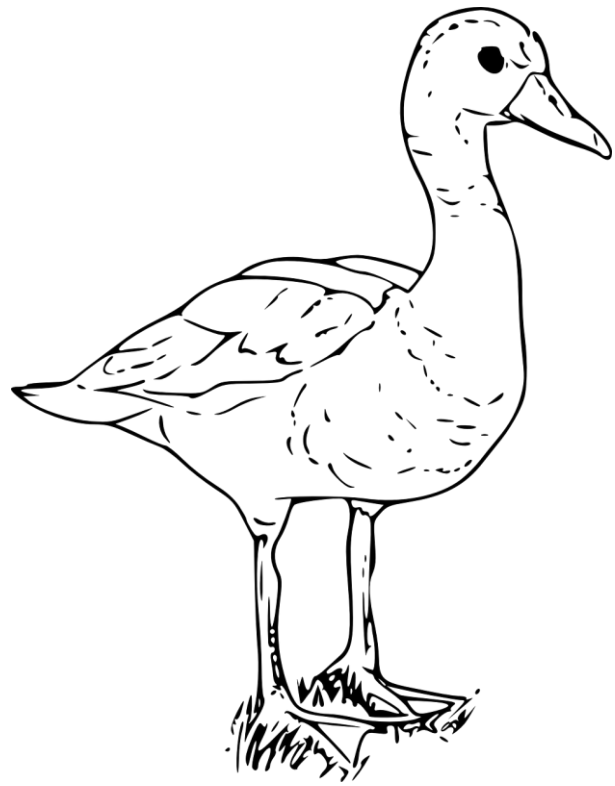

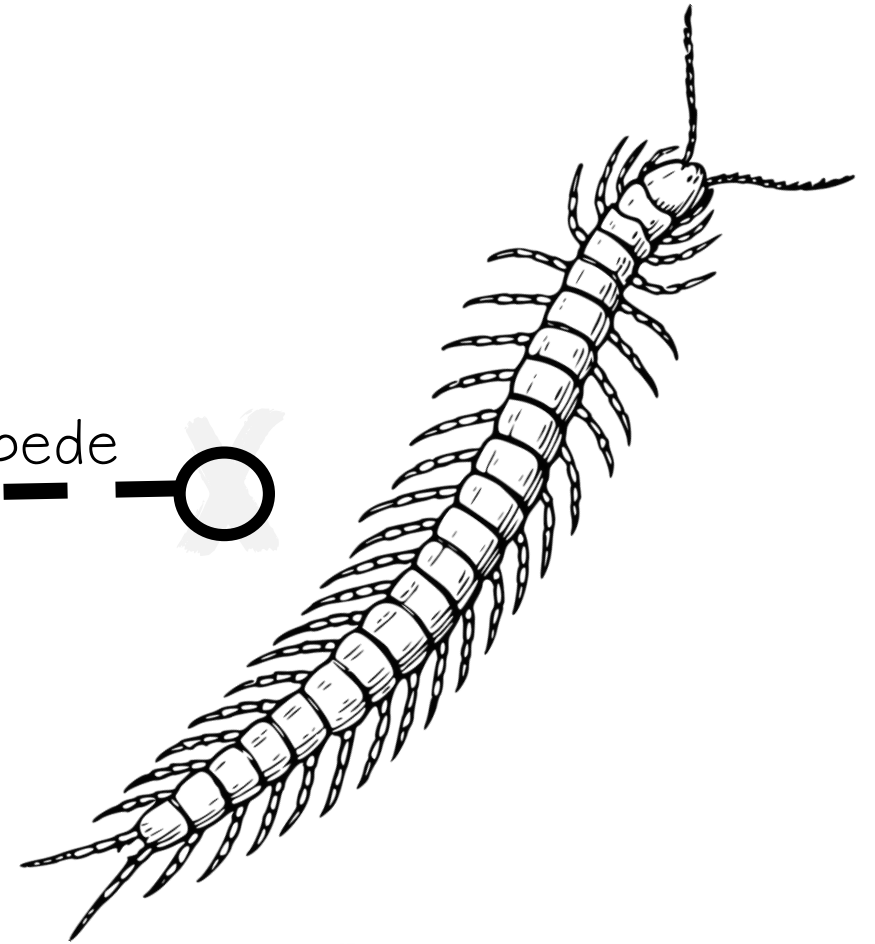

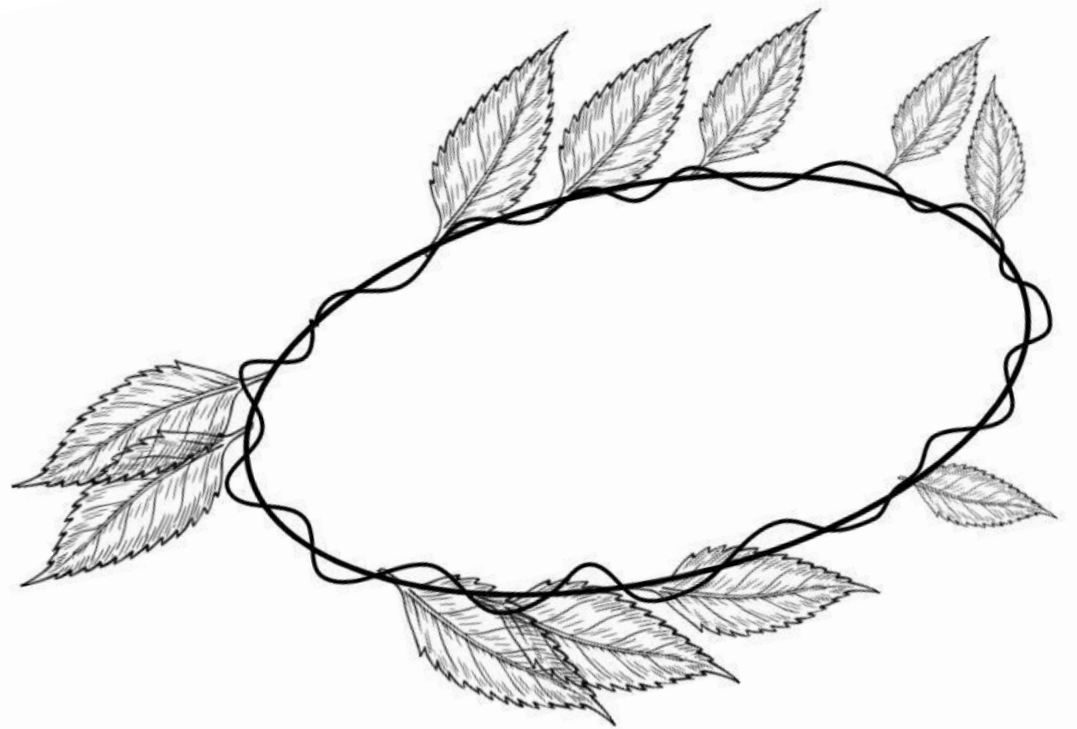
Nature Crown

Directions: Follow the steps to build a crown using items and materials found outside.

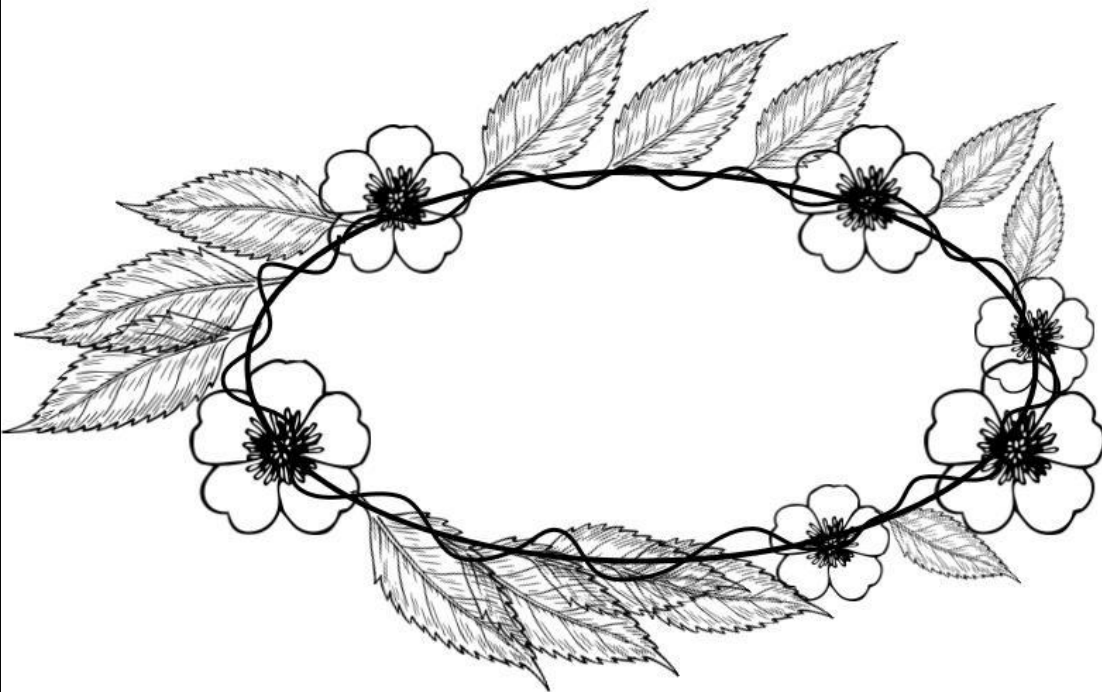
- 1** Gather flexible twigs, long grasses, flowers or leaves to create your crown. Be creative.

- 4** Draw or take a picture and glue it here of your finished crown.

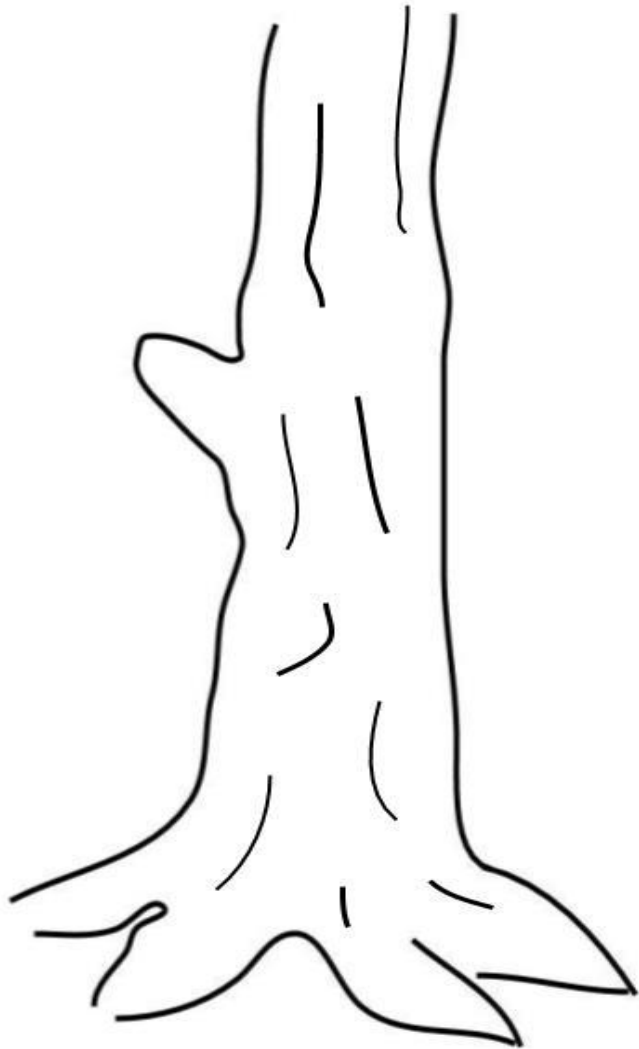

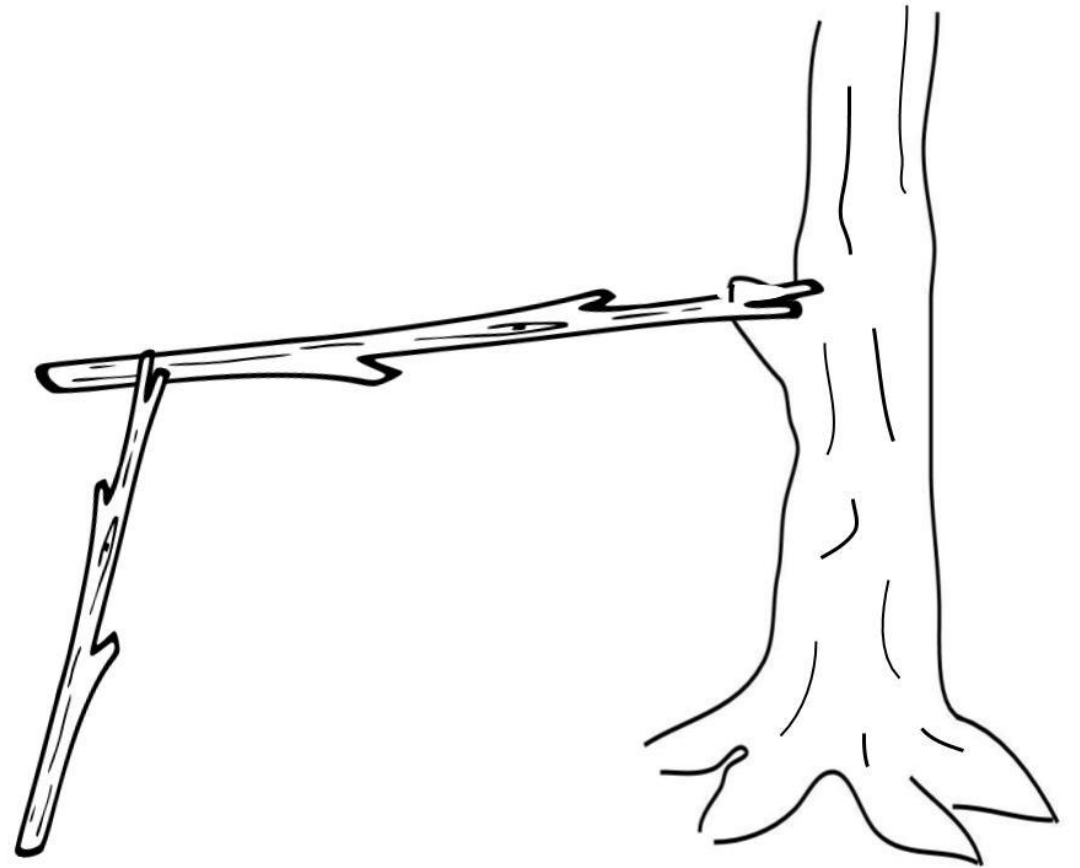
Design and Build Woodland Fort

Directions: Follow the steps to create a woodland fort using items and materials found outside.

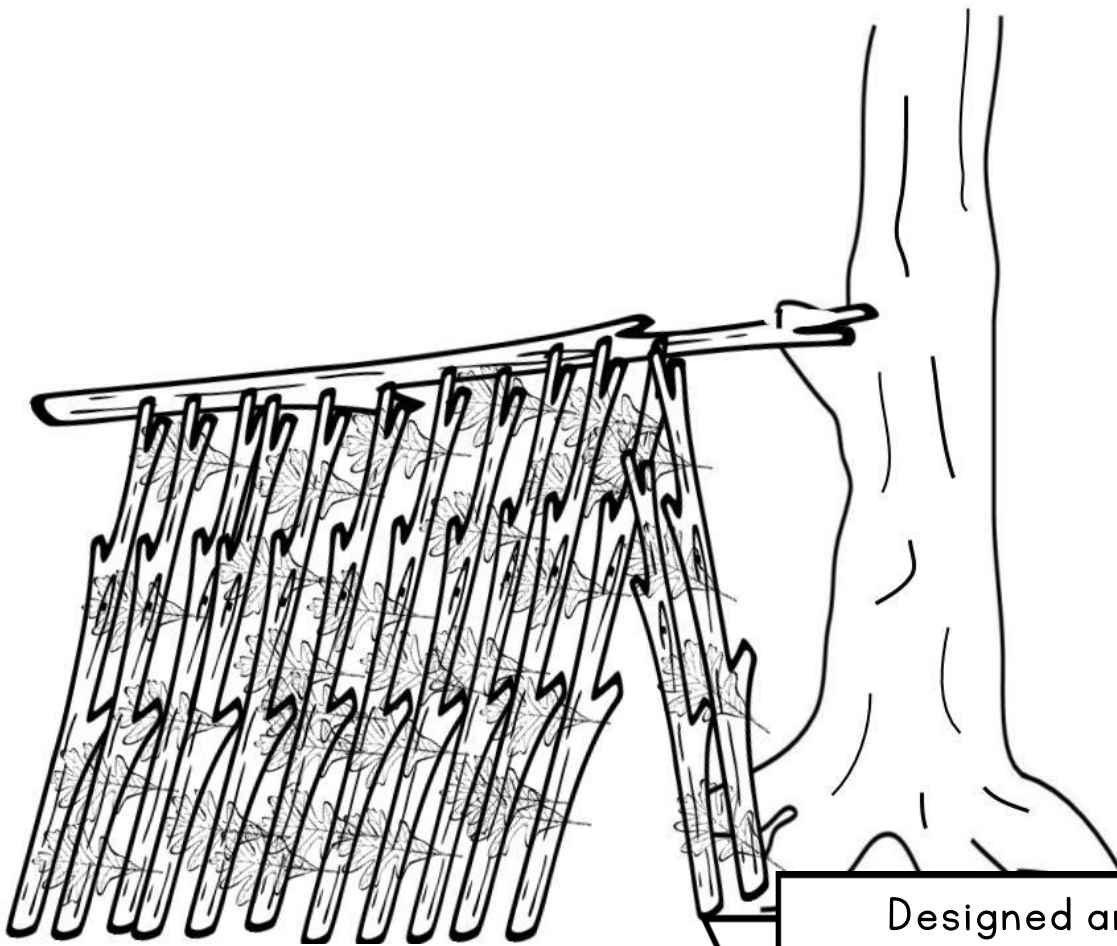
- 1 Find a good base to build your fort upon.

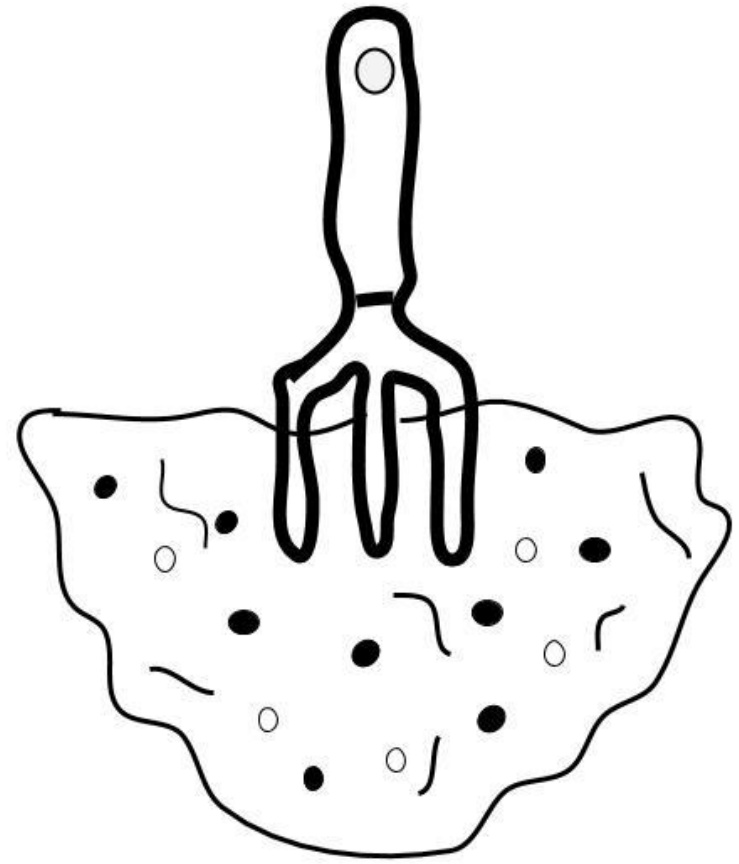
Design and Build Worm Charmer

Directions: Follow the steps and see if you can become a worm charmer:

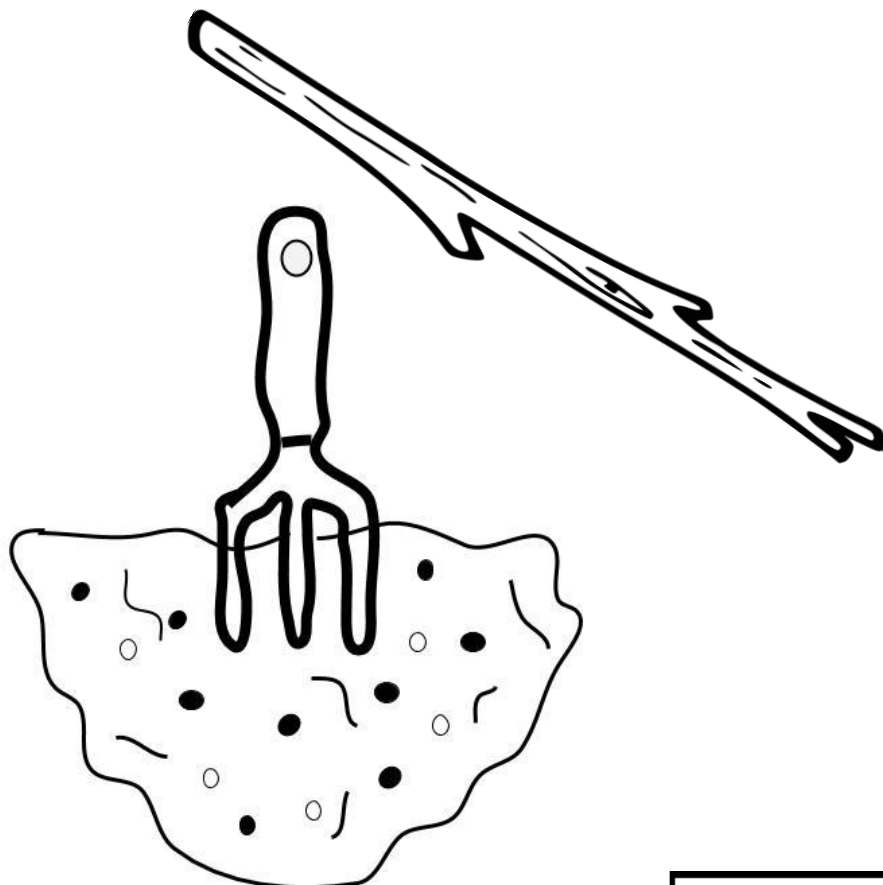
- 1** Locate a cool, moist spot away from direct sunlight.

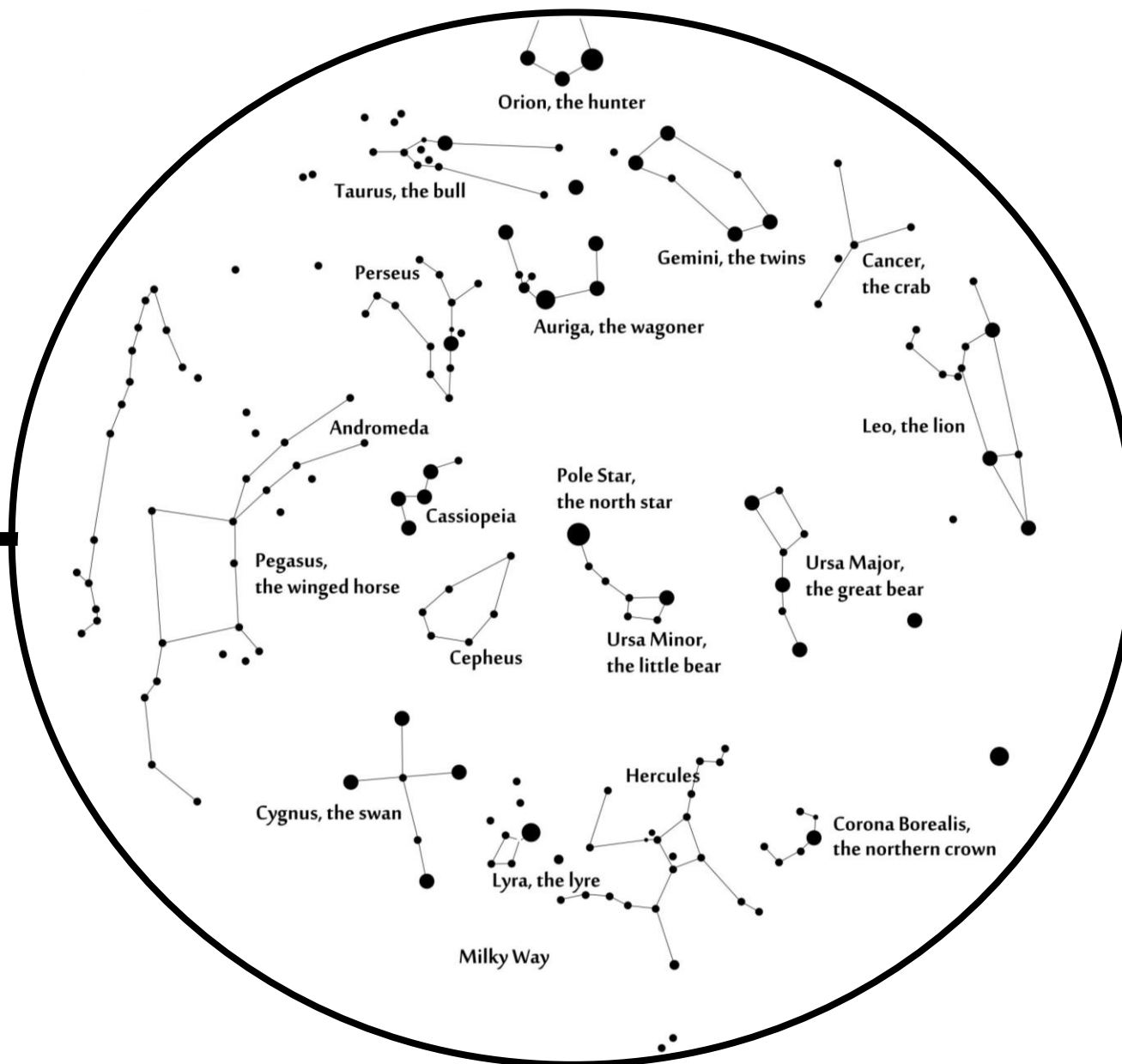
