
Directions: Find the fundamental elements a bird needs to survive in your backyard:




Water: Every bird needs water for drinking and bathing, Color the stream if you have a pond, stream, bird bath or other source of water.

Nesting: Birds need a place to build a nest during breeding season. Color the trees and bushes if you have some in your backyard.


Shelter: Birds need places to hide from predators and stay safe during storms. Color the sky if you find tree hollows, tall shrubs, or other forms of protection.









